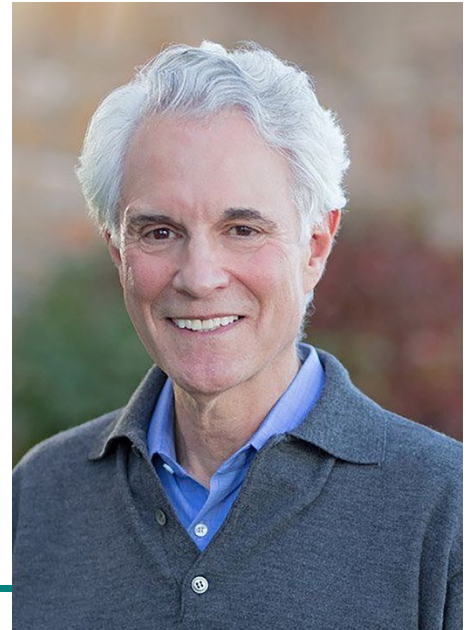


## **DANIEL C. SILVERMAN, MD, MPA**
